



“A Simple Way To Pray” (Part 3) *Matthew 6: 9-13*

INTRODUCTION: Living The Lord’s Prayer

- * You can’t say “Hallowed Be Your Name” unless Christ has first priority in your own life.
- * Challenge: Think about how your life and your words will speak of God to those around you. Pray that God would have a great reputation on your frontline. (family, work, neighborhood, etc.)
- * When we pray this line of the Lord’s Prayer, we’re asking that God would have a great reputation amongst the people of the earth. We’re asking that God would be held in high esteem. God’s name is glorified when His people live well, and when they speak well of Him to others.
- * Hallowed – holy; set apart; reverence

Four Foundational Truths Connected To God’s Name:

1. God’s name reminds us that He will _____.
 - My God will supply all that you need from His glorious resources in Christ Jesus. And may glory be to our God and our Father for ever and ever, Amen.
(Philippians 4: 19-20 - JB Phillips Translation)
2. God’s name reminds us that He _____.
 - And this will be His name: “The Lord is our Righteousness.” In that day Judah will be saved, and Israel will live in safety.
(Jeremiah 23:6 – The New Living Translation)

- God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God.
(2 Corinthians 5:21 – New International Version)
- 3. God’s name reminds us that He wants us _____.
 - Then Gideon built an altar there to God and named it “God’s Peace.” It’s still called that at Ophrah of Abiezer.
(Judges 6:24 – The Message)
- 4. God’s name reminds us that He wants to provide _____.
 - He heals the broken in heart, and binds up their wounds.
(Psalm 147:3 – Modern English Version)
